Pathway 1: Functional Skills/BTEC/GSCE

Students enter this pathway if they are NC levels 4 +

- GCSE English and Maths
- Functional Skills Level 1 /2 in English and Maths
- GCSE Biology
- BTEC ICT
- Optional subjects – where appropriate (e.g. BTECs/courses at Lonsdale and Marriotts)

Pathway 2: Functional Skills/ASDAN PSD

Students enter this pathway if they are NC levels 2/3

- Functional Skills English Entry Levels
- Functional Skills Maths Entry Levels
- ASDAN PSD Entry levels 1, 2 & 3 – Life Skills
- Optional subjects – where appropriate (e.g. BTEC)

Pathway 3: ASDAN PP

Students enter this pathway if they are NC levels 1 and below (p levels)

- English Lessons
- Maths Lessons
- ASDAN PP Entry level 1 – Life Skills

- Delivered through PHSCE, ASDAN and Enterprise lessons
- All learners will have an annual WRL week:
 - Careers talks and workshops
 - Work experience placements in and outside of school for a minimum of 2 days
 - Learning and Skills Journal

Transition to College and Adulthood

Throughout: we will support you to prepare:

- 3 progress meetings (Autumn, Spring & Summer) - future planning and college representatives
- EHCP Meetings
- Transition college visits : 4 stages:
 1. Take your child on a tour - year 12 / early in year 13
 2. Assessment visits – January of year 13
 3. Application - by March of year 13
 4. Transition visits x 2/3 – May of year 13 onwards
- Celebration Leavers Prom and Assembly
