Subject	Autumn Term
English	<p>First and Second Half Term:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Phonics: diagraphs and tricky words Spelling, punctuation and grammar: Recap; Verbs, Noun, Pronoun, adjective, adverb, preposition, Conjunction, Interjection, Proper Noun, Determiner, Fronted Adverbial. Storyboard writing: plot, characterisation, setting, using story frames, writing individual and class stories and books Group reading: myths and legends from Ancient Egypt, other traditional tales, myths and legends Individual Reading Programmes.
Maths	A number of topics including: time, measurement (capacity), geometry, data analysis, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, patterns, fractions, directions, ratios, co-ordinates,
Science	<p>First and Half Term: Sound and Scientists and Inventors</p> <p>Second Half Term: Healthy lifestyles - healthy eating (to include digestive system); energy in food, benefits of exercise</p>
ICT	Students will have the opportunity to create and use word documents and PowerPoints. They will also do some photography.
PSHCE/RSHE	<p>First half term: Boundaries (including online) Friends & respectful relationships; equal opportunities; all about me</p> <p>Second half term: British Values/Citizenship; rights & responsibilities, rules; Cultural, religion & Diversity</p>
Creative	<p>First half term Art- Painting- colours, mixing, lines</p> <p>Second half term Sculpture- materials, sticking Music- Learn about pitch and sounds, exploring instruments, describe music using different vocabulary</p>
Food Technology and Home Economics	Pupils will plan, prepare and cook dishes from around the world. They will be involved in thinking about food groups, healthy eating and budgeting for meals whilst participating in hands-on Cooking sessions.
K&U	<p>Geography: Map skills</p> <p>History: Transport and the history of railways</p>
PE/Swimming	<p>First half term: Ball skills</p> <p>Second half term: Boccia / target games Pupils will work on individually set swimming target in timetabled swimming sessions.</p>
Forest School and Task Master	Students will get the opportunity to work with other classes to take part in Task-Master-type challenges and Forest-School activities. These help pupils develop problem-solving and thinking skills.
