Whole-School News



Lonsdale School hosted the Stevenage Green Network this week.
Teachers from other local schools came to visit Lonsdale to share their ideas about sustainability and environmental education. Some classes took part in designing a new logo for the network.

Earlier this week, pupils learnt and explored 'Chinese New Year', and the lunch on that day was an extra-special selection of Chinese delights. Next week, we are looking forward to celebrating 'Children's Mental Health Week'. This year's theme is "Growing Together". Dolphin Class: This week we have changed our role play area into a clothes and shoe shop. The children have enjoyed trying on clothes and shoes and continuing to learn about money by counting and paying for the items. We have listened to 'The smartest giant in town' and 'The Elves and the Shoemaker', then the children have made their own clothes book. We have measured our feet and ordered shoes from long to short. The children have worked hard choosing materials to then make their very own sock puppets, which have turned out amazing. The children have continued to work hard on their phonics and in PE have worked on bat and ball skills. In Cooking we made sausage rolls.



Bumblebee Class:

This week the Bumblebee Class have had a very exciting week. The Bumblebee Class enjoyed learning all about Chinese New Year and exploring different foods that people eat on Chinese New Year. In Cooking we made spring rolls, and in PE we focused on moving over, under and through different apparatus. In PBL we have been looking at tents for Teddy, creating our PBL final project book and continuing to explore money.

Primary News

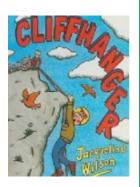


Owl Class:

This weeks story was 'Goldilocks and The Three Bears'. In Cooking we made honey-and-oat cookies. In PBL, the children made a bed for Goldilocks based on their knowledge of materials and their properties. The children did lots of sorting and describing objects of different sizes. In PE, the children have all made visible effort and improvement. We are all really proud of their achievements.



Koala Class: In Literacy we drafted our acrostic poems! In Numeracy we had a go at writing some Chinese numbers and using money to go in our good luck envelopes. In Topic we carried out a floating-and-sinking experiment, may have got splashed in the process! In Cooking we made vegetable soup. In Life Skills we looked at food packages to work out where food comes from and developed our computer skills to make a food rainbow. In Forest School we explored the nature around us by playing I-Spy and Hide-and-Seek. We enjoyed racing our cars with Sea Turtles in Creative.







Secondary News







Wombat Class:

We continue to read our book, Cliffhanger, and this week we described the different characters and tried to recall who said what! In Maths we have been learning our number bonds to 5 or 10 and created some rainbows to help us with this. The children enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year and how it is celebrated. They also found the story behind how the animals were chosen interesting. Everybody then made a tiger, as it's the year of the tiger this year, and we also decorated a Chinese lantern using coloured tissue paper. We continued this theme in Forest Schools and created collages using natural resources. In PSHCE we learnt about uncomfortable feelings and how to deal with them.

Hippopotamus Class: In PE the Hippo Class have been continuing with their gymnastics. They explored the different apparatus and created sequences to include travel along, under or over and balances on or using the apparatus to support. In PSHCE, pupils have been exploring the issues around body image and the role of the media in creating unrealistic expectations. In Geography, we have investigated the factors that early and invading settlers need to establish places to live. In their Maths lessons this week, the Hippo Class have been working on finding the area of right-angled triangles as well as dabbling in some Maths mini-golf. In Science the class have been working hard to explain how the Earth rotates as it orbits the sun and how this gives us night and day. In Creative, we have explored block and blended artwork inspired by Mark Rothco, implementing them into our art-based surroundings. In K&U Hippos have continued their Judaism topic, learning about festivals and relating traditions back to what they do at home.

Sea Turtle Class:

Last week ended with us continuing to do some work on algorithms in Computing. We did this by learning to programme some computerised toys—which was great fun. In Cooking this week, the class made some scones. In K&U, we continued to learn about 'Crime and Punishment' in Victorian times. The students enjoyed getting into character— Miss Read was made to dress up, too! This week was the start of Chinese New Year, so we have also been learning about that by watching videos and creating some lovely collages. In Maths, the students did some addition work related to Chinese New Year and also some subtraction work. In English, the class continued to do literacy work related to the class book. In PE, the class really enjoyed exploring the soft play equipment during our gymnastics lesson.

Vaquita Class:

In PSHCE this week, pupils helped celebrate the Chinese New Year by exploring some greetings and responses in Mandarin. They also started to crack some Chinese food-related clues using their calculation skills. In English, we looked at how David Walliams uses lists, font sizes and styles as well as exaggerated punctuation to create emphasis and dramatic effects when reading. In Science, pupils went on a minibeast hunt (mentioned last week), so this is a picture of the invertebrates we found...



Gorilla Class:

In Science Gorilla Class are continuing learning about life cycles, this week are looking at the life cycle of the frog. If you would like to support your child with this topic, they have the book 'My Life' allocated on Bug Club (login details in diaries), which explains the life cycles of the butterfly and the frog. Our Textiles project is going well - this week, we expect to join the seams of the bags.

The children enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year and how it is celebrated. They also found the story behind how the animals were chosen interesting. Everybody then made a tiger, as it's the year of the tiger this year, and they also decorated a Chinese lantern using coloured tissue paper. In PSHCE we discussed things we like and completed some work about activities that makes us happy.

Tasmanian Devil Class:

Wow, another week has gone already; we have been furthering our knowledge of reading maps by investigating and applying 6-point grid coordinates, scale and contour lines and what they mean. Bear Grylls watch out! We have been working on elapsed time understanding time to improve our time-management skills in Maths. We have been learning CPR and its links to the cardiovascular system with some tremendous life-saving skills in Science. We started working on poetry in English, looking into 'poetry terms' and learning what makes a good poem. Working as a class, we produce an acrostic poem about Grandpa (from 'Grandpa's Great Escape'). In Food Tech, we made some delicious cheese scones; they were consumed before home time by some students!



Upper School News



Elephant Class:

Between our Maths topic and our song choices, E Class have been singing 'Money, money, money' all week! In English they went to the library to choose new reading books and see all the lovely books on offer. We have continued our forces topic in Science, looking at paper airplanes are how far they go depending on their design features.

In PSHCE/Life Skills, Elephant Class have been making their own plastic bag holders using tea towels!

Lynx Class:

In Maths we have been working hard on calculating elapsed time, understanding how to organise time as well as looking at the various time zones throughout the world. In Business we are slowly organising and finalising our 'Friendship/Valentines' packs, which will be available for purchase after half term - watch this space. Some students enjoyed representing the school at the official opening of the Brittain-Way underpass artwork installation. Please see page 4! And finally, in English we continued our work practising and refining skills whilst working towards our Functional Skills English.

Panda Class: In English we practiced the discussion element of the Speaking and Listening exam. In Maths this week we have been consolidating our learning of money, including calculating change. In Chemistry we continue to learn about bonding and have been learning to find the charges of elements to make compounds. In ICT we have been developing our learning of 3D modelling, creating floor plans to make more complex houses. In Drama we continue to explore character, we have been rehearsing extracts from 'Blood Brothers'. We have submitted our plans for the memorial garden and have ordered items, we hope to be able to start renovating the area when the warmer weather arrives!

Lunchtime News from our MSAs

This week Lonsdale pupils enjoyed using the Duplo and Lego bricks, attending the film club and joining football matches in the secondary playground. These are getting more and more popular with pupils and staff joining in. The lunchtime Sports Club also ran this week, and the Play Leaders helped with playground activities on Monday.

Participants should be aged 11-18, and should have a physical disability.

Accommodation

Dormitory accommodation is provided for participants and teachers. Two hotel rooms will also be available per school. The entry form will require you to state who is staying in each hotel room. Shower chairs are available in both the dormitories and hotel rooms.

Catering

All meals will be provided. Dietary requirements are requested on entry form.

Venue and Parking

Stoke Mandeville Stadium is the Birthplace of the Paralympic movement and therefore fully accessible. There is ample accessible parking on site for cars, mini buses and coaches.

Entry and Payment Deadlines

Please complete the entry form digitally as it has pre-populated drop-down fields. The entry form contains two tabs. One for school entries and one for parent/guardian entries. A parent can attend with up to two children. Due to an anticipated increase in the event's popularity, schools can bring a maximum of 20 children and 15 staff.

Entry fee per teacher/parent/participant requiring accommodation = £75 each Entry fee per teacher/parent/participant without accommodation = £35 each

The entry deadline is Friday 20 May 2022 – no entries will be accepted after this date.

Fees must be paid in full by 31 May 2022. Registration for the event cannot be confirmed until payment has been received. Refunds cannot be issues unless one weeks' notice of cancellation is received prior to the start of the event.

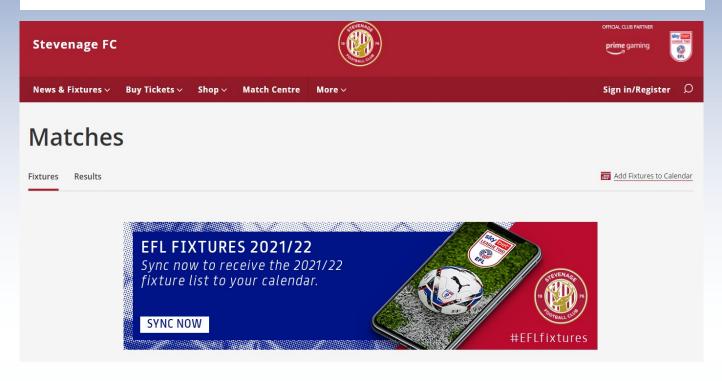

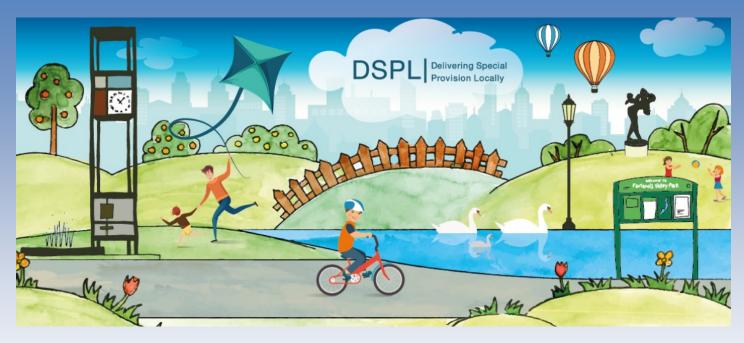

Lateral Flow Testing at Lonsdale

Up to one third of people who have coronavirus experience no symptoms. By testing, we will help to stop the virus spread and help to keep our school open as safely as possible. Testing is voluntary, but we as a school would encourage everyone to test regularly.

* also available to schools, settings and professionals

Households, childcare and/or support bubbles who have children/adults that attend/work at schools can pick up home testing kits from local test sites or request home test kits to be delivered by visiting https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests.

Lateral Flow Tests are preferably conducted up to twice a week with a minimum of 3 days and a maximum of 5 days between each test. If you would like to home-test your child, please test Sunday and Wednesday evenings so that results of these tests are ready prior to Monday and Thursday mornings.

All results from LFT need to be reported to the NHS, and this can be done by visiting the following website: https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result.

Reporting results to school is no longer required.

Cyberbullying

What is Cyberbullying and online Harassment?

- Cyberbullying is any form of bullying which takes place online.
- This can be done over smartphones, tablets, online gaming, chat rooms, social media and more.
- Online harassment is the act of sending offensive, rude and insulting messages and being abusive.
- If someone purposefully keeps sending you offensive messages that make you feel scared, it could be illegal.



- Bullying someone whether online or offline is wrong.
- It can badly affect their mental health.
- Harassing someone and/or sending malicious or threatening messages to someone repeatedly is ILLEGAL.
- If you are found to be cyberbullying someone, there could be criminal consequences.

How to cope with the effects of Cyberbullying

- You must not blame yourself. Noone deserves to treated cruely by anyone.
- It can make you feel very upset, alone and like noone will understand or help you.
- REMEMBER you are not alone and there are lots of people who can help you. Make sure you tell someone and do not try to deal with this on your own.

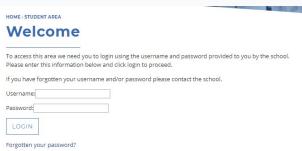
