We believe that pupils learn best when they are active participants in planned educational experiences, appropriate to their level of development. Lonsdale School is a WAS Award School and we will:

- offer provision and interventions that match the needs of our pupils and staff
- raise awareness of the importance of mental health awareness as part of our Relationships Education, Relationship and Sex Education, and Health Education which is age appropriate, sequential and coproduced with families
- capture the views of parents, pupils and teachers on mental health issues

- offer our young people and their families bespoke counselling support tailored to their individual need.
- support our staff by offering them clinical supervision and to develop a psychological/self-care programme

We believe in promoting mental health as part of every day school life for all members of our school community. Improving the emotional wellbeing is in the heart of our person-centred approach. We are committed to ensure that mental health problems are identified early and appropriate support provided

- The Governing Body and the school leadership team will ensure that the required infrastructure and resources are in place to offer staff CPD
- Staff are engaged in the review and development of their job standards/roles.
- Staff have personalised learning pathways to develop in their roles
- Staff job satisfaction, training needs and wellbeing is surveyed twice a year to gauge staff views and provide the school with reliable and relevant data.
- The school has clear succession planning across all areas and levels of the school.
- Staff recruitment and resourcing is dynamic and appropriate
- There is a clear staff-reward scheme in place that will recognise commitment, professional knowledge and skills, talent and impact upon the whole school community.

- We support our pupils to develop wider understanding of assistive technology that is available to promote independence in their daily lives and to become autonomous.

- We will launch The Lonsdale Learning Centre which will offer a wide range of courses and events to promote learning, collaboration and information sharing.
- As a pdnet Champion School we will promote and deliver training courses for professionals and parents using high quality pdnet resources.
- We will continue our commitment to 'Improving the Outcomes for students with SEND: Change across a number of schools – project' to create a common assessment/framework system for students with SEND
- We will establish new research partnerships with our partner universities

Innovation and evidence-based research – Centre of Excellence

Lonsdale is a school for physically and neurologically impaired young people aged from 3 to 18 years. Each of our pupils has unique and sometimes complex needs.

In addition to a physical or neurological impairment, some pupils may have sensory loss, a medical condition or associated difficulty in learning.
