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| Literacy: | <p>Individual and shared reading; O.R.T. Oxford Reading Tree, Bug Club, Recognising high frequency words, labels & captions, sentence construction; writing labels, sentences, locating information in fiction and non-fiction texts; rhymes; punctuation; spelling; handwriting (where applicable); speaking & listening; Letters & Sounds: blending phonemes to read words.
