Literacy:	Individual and shared reading; O.R.T. Oxford Reading Tree, Bug Club, Recognising high frequency words, Little Wandle daily phonics, labels & captions, sentence construction; writing labels, sentences, locating information in fiction and non-fiction texts; rhymes; punctuation; spelling; handwriting (where applicable); speaking & listening; Term 1- Fiction- Word reading focus- Poem writing- word recognition, rhyming words, changing letters Term 2- Fiction- Transcription focus- Story writing- planning, sequencing, writing, evaluating
Numeracy	Number- Counting, sorting, sequencing, matching, ordering, number bonds, digit representations – ‘tens and units’, place value, doubles & halving, understanding symbols and calculations – addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, real life problems; fractions $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, SSM- Length, weight and capacity using Non Standard Units of measurement and cm, mm, g, kg, ml and l, temperature- hot, cold, degrees, shape 2D /3D- names and properties, patterns, position, directions, Other- time – o’clock, half past, quarter past/to, hours and minutes, money- coin recognition, graph recognition
