English

- Phonics – Little Wandle daily SSP
- Development of fine motor & early writing skills
- Early reading skills to include sharing and reading books, library books etc. in line with Little Wandle
- Using non-fiction books and computers to extract information
- Poetry writing competition – styles of poetry.
- Instructional writing.

Science

Focus on forces and magnets:

- Types of forces and how they act.
- Magnetic/non-magnetic, sorting and grouping, repelling and attracting.

Focus on dinosaurs and rocks:

- Investigating fossils – how were they formed, found and their significance
- Who were the dinosaurs and what happened to them?

Maths

- Counting and number recognition skills (individual targets)
- 1:1 correspondence
- Matching and comparing
- Number bonds
- Weights and mass – comparing, measuring and using
- Capacity – comparing, measuring and using.

Creative

Music

- Rhythm, pitch and tempo.

Art

- Art & design - exploring Romans mosaics.
 - Sharing opinions about famous Artworks
 - Taking inspiration from
 - Re-creating/working in 3D
 - Evaluating final Artwork.

PBL

PBL takes a cross-curricular approach, where learning in discrete subjects supports the pupils in a final 'project'.

- Spring Term

The final project will be a spring musical, performed for parents/carers and the school community shortly before Easter. The musical will bring together learning throughout the Spring term, on the topic of saving the environment and recycling. Dragonfly and Alpaca class' will work together for the final project.

Class Books:

Computing

- Embedded throughout the curriculum

Outdoor Learning

- Exploring creativity with natural materials & seasonal changes

Interventions

- Focus on computing/ICT (using a keyboard, logging on etc)

Cooking

- Pupils will plan, prepare and cook a variety of dishes in two 'teams'. They will be involved in thinking about food groups, healthy eating and budgeting for meals whilst participating in hands-on Cooking sessions.
- Pupils will function as 2 groups during cooking lessons, planning, preparing and providing 2 versions of the planned dish to be judged by a third party in a blind taste test.
