Robin Class all returned from half term happy and refreshed! They have enjoyed learning about Halloween through all their lessons this week. At the beginning of the week, we talked about how people celebrate Halloween, and we enjoyed searching for pictures in coloured sand using our hands and paintbrushes. In Maths we have been giving our numbered spiders legs, and we have been investigating size using our different-sized pumpkins. In Creative we sang 'Incy Wincy Spider' and '5 little pumpkins' and created our very own googly-eyed spiders and pumpkins.

It was lovely to see the Monkey Class back after half term, refreshed and ready to learn, working well with reading and ordering numbers. They have explored fireworks, listening to and making their own poem. They have started the new topic on 'Light' in Science, exploring sources of light and knowledge of dark in the sensory room. They have explored emotions well, both in PE linked to dance and in PSHCE. They have started to learn about landmarks, exploring through play, London landmarks. In RE they have started the topic on 'Belonging'.

Alpaca Class have had a busy week this week. They enjoyed starting a new topic in Science on light. They had fun experimenting with torches and searching the school for different light sources. The class loved singing spooky songs in music. Alpacas had lots fun at the Halloween disco. In English we learnt about fiction and non-fiction and had to sort books into the right category. In PSHE we learnt about different jobs people do and how they help us.

Dragonfly Class had a fantastic first week back, getting started on our new topics for the half term. In Science we will exploring 'light' and pupils shared some wonderful ideas around what they would like to learn. We had some lovely discussions about symbolism in RE after reading the story of Rama & Sita, and the pupils wrote some beautiful poems about Bonfire Night in English. In PE we teamed up with Alpaca Class for some big games, and it was lovely to see pupils' sportsmanship in cheering each other on.

In Literacy we started to look at the difference between letters and postcards. In Numeracy we played higher or lower game to develop our understanding of greater than and less than numbers. In Science we started our new topic 'Light and Sound' and described what the parts of the ear do. In History we enjoyed acting out the timeline of our new topic - Anglo Saxons. We looked at the reasons as to why we celebrate Halloween and Guy Fawkes Night, acting out the story. In TaskMaster, we enjoyed working with Wombats and Sea Turtles to make a firework picture.

The class had a fun start to the week learning about Halloween & choosing themed suncatchers to make. They enjoyed their first yoga session on Tuesday afternoon. In Creative they used shaving foam and paint to make some amazing pictures. All thoroughly enjoyed this activity. In Science we started our new topic, the skeletal system, and we identified internal & external parts of the body, and the main roles of the major organs. We also started our new Maths topic, measure, and we ordered objects by size.

In English we have been taking our Speaking and Listening assessments. Mrs North is very proud of our progress in our learning. In Computing we have been learning about the internet, history of networking and the protocols involved using networks and the internet. We have recapped our learning in how to send an email, the fictions of an email, a publishing design program (Canva) and PowerPoint.

We started the week last week by doing our 'half-term news' - it was lovely to hear how much fun everyone had. In Science, the class started their new topic about the body learning about the heart. In Maths, they learnt about bigger than, smaller than and equal numbers. In RE, we learnt about Diwali- the Hindu Festival of Light. We planned an assembly we are doing soon by deciding what we should say, and we made some Rangoli patterns to show. The Halloween disco was brilliant — we had some very scary characters in class! In Geography, we started to learn about the seven continents of the world.

We started our week by discussing all about our half term news and the excitement of the Halloween Disco, which was a scream!

We gave the reception area a Remembrance-Day makeover, we have had lots of poppies and family history put up to reflect this. We also looked at 'What life is like in Whitby' and looked closer into the heart and the circulatory system in our bodies and their jobs.

This week, pupils have returned from half term refreshed and ready to learn! We had a class assembly on Wednesday all about All Saints Day. The pupils worked together to research about St Valentine, John the Baptist and St Nicholas. They created some resources to be shared with the rest of Secondary/Upper school, and most were happy to present their work to the audience. This was very brave. The school Halloween disco was also a great hit, and the pupils looked amazing in their costumes.

In our vocational lessons, we have continued with our sensory-music unit and have played percussion instruments in time with music.

We also have been practising for the inter-schools Boccia tournament, which is happening next week.

We had a lot of rain last week during lunchtimes. That meant that we had to spend some time indoors, where we used the library, attended film club, or some pupils enjoyed the large games, like Connect 4 or sharing stories

When the weather was better, we ventured outside with our friends to play hide and seek or to go for a walk.

Cyberbullying

What is Cyberbullying and online Harassment?

- Cyberbullying is any form of bullying which takes place online.
- This can be done over smartphones, tablets, online gaming, chat rooms, social media and more.
- Online harassment is the act of sending offensive, rude and insulting messages and being abusive.
- If someone purposefully keeps sending you offensive messages that make you feel scared, it could be illegal.



- Bullying someone whether online or offline is wrong.
- · It can badly affect their mental health.
- Harassing someone and/or sending malicious or threatening messages to someone repeatedly is ILLEGAL.
- If you are found to be cyberbullying someone, there could be criminal consequences.

How to cope with the effects of Cyberbullying

- You must not blame yourself. Noone deserves to treated cruely by anyone.
- It can make you feel very upset, alone and like noone will understand or help you.
- REMEMBER you are not alone and there are lots of people who can help you. Make sure you tell someone and do not try to deal with this on your own.

What to do if you are being cyberbullied

If someone is bullying you, here is what you can do to put a stop to it....get SMART.

Screenshot any nasty messages.

My privacy settings.

Avoid talking to them any further.

Report the incident on whatever site you are using.

Talk to someone (parent, carer, teacher, friend or the police if necessary).

When to tell the Police

- If you are ever threatened with physical harm, being repeatedly harassed, being sent malicious messages.
- If it's not an immediate emergency, phone 101 or use our online webchat service.
- If it is an immediate emergency phone 999.
