PRIMARY



News

Robin class started the week learning about what it means to be kind and how we can be kind to others. In English we read 'Little beaver and the echo', where Little Beaver made many friends on his journey to find his echo. In Maths we have been learning about more and less as well as our primary colours. During the week we have been adding to our kindness flower, which we will displaying this coming week. On Friday the children painted spots on Pudsey Bear and made Pudsey ears to encourage listening in Phonics.

Monkey Class this week in English have learnt about letter writing, listening to a story called 'Meerkat Mail', and then they wrote their own letter. They have explored reflection in the mirror, enjoying the sensory room. In Geography they have continued their learning on landmarks, playing a guess the landmark game. In Art they painted a Pudsey and then made one out of leaves for Outdoor Learning. In PE they developed their ball skills, ready for ball-skills competition.

Alpaca Class had a lovely week. They did some beautiful poses and stretching in yoga. In IT they had to learn how to sort data and described different objects. They did some lovely singing in Music. In English they did some more sorting between what is fiction and non fiction. They enjoyed the sensory story 'Can't you sleep little bear' and did some role play. They learnt about 3D shapes and explored them by making different models.

Dragonfly Class had a great time exploring light and shadows last week! We explored opaque and transparent materials, and learnt that light travels in straight lines whilst making our own shadow puppets. We joined up with Falcon class for some wonderful discussions around bullying and friendship as part of anti-bullying week, and each pupil chose someone in school to recognise as a 'kindness hero'. Christmas play rehearsals are in full swing, so watch this space for an invitation to a very special Christmas performance (written and directed by the pupils!).

In Literacy we looked at formal and informal language. In Numeracy we developed our understanding of column subtraction and starting to work on borrowing. In Science we used different mediums to make good earmuffs and looked at what makes up the eye to start our light topic. In History we learned how the Anglo-Saxons houses were very different to today's. We enjoyed working out in FitKidz, and we enjoyed working with Wombats and Sea Turtles in Taskmaster in a 'Children in Need' board game.

SECONDARY News



In Geography the class has been learning about coastal features. They used sand, water & building blocks to represent dunes, the beach, cliffs & an arch. In RE they have been finding about the destinations of Christian pilgrims. In English they have heard how Kensuke & Michael spent a night helping baby sea turtles find their way to the sea. We had a fabulous time at our sports trip on Wednesday. The students took part in lots of different sports, including basketball, boccia, Polybat, skittles and target throw. See the photos below!

Hippo Class worked hard last week in all their lessons. They continued in Maths working with addition, subtraction and problem-solving. In 'Everybody Reads', pupils started in their new groups, and many have made good progress with their reading and comprehension. They all enjoyed the activities on offer for exploring anti-bullying and joined in on Friday for Children-in-Need Day.

Monday last week was World Kindness Day, and the class did a number of activities related to this including sharing who their kindness heroes are and why, and also looking at all of the amazing things about themselves. In Creative, the class has been working on a project related to the Stevenage Christmas Trail. They were asked to make a 3D Christmas tree related to a Christmas song, and they chose 'The Twelve Days of Christmas'. The tree looks amazing! In Maths, they did counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. In Geography, we used globes and atlases to plot our dream journeys around the world!

In Geography the class has been learning about coastal features. They used sand, water & building blocks to represent dunes, the beach, cliffs & an arch. In Science they have been learning about the skeleton and the function of different bones in the body. They were surprised to see the school skeleton standing in the corner of the classroom! In English, they are finding out about island life for Miachael & Kensuke and the role the orangutan family play.

This week in English, pupils have learned that Bruno still does not know what is going on at 'OutWith', and he meets Shmuel for the first time. Using the text as clues, they created their own images of Shmuel and described what he might be feeling. In Maths, pupils have been learning about shapes and angles (acute are little, and so 'are cute' - while obtuse are 'fat'...). They had a lovely session with Ms Small about being kind and demonstrated these attributes beautifully during the week.

News

Wow, another week speeding by, we have learnt loads this week. In English we did some speaking and listening exercise where students had to find out information from each other. In K&U we visited Ecuador to find out the geographical differences between America and the United Kingdom. In History we designed some WW1/2 recruitment posters for the Home Front, and in Creative we have tried our hand with leather printing. In Maths the class had Maths Challenges delivered by Mrs Ottridge, which caused a debate about the answers!

During our English lessons we looked at newspapers; the differences between tabloids and broadsheets particularly the headlines. In Maths this week we have been learning how to factorise and expand brackets. In Science we been learning how to plot graphs to measure rates of reaction. We continue to work on our AQA UAS in our Vocational learning, some of then topics being studied are 'Nutrition in Sport' 'Creative Writing' and 'Coding'. It is our assembly next week, and we have chosen to present about the importance of Mental Health and reintroduce our Well-being Ambassadors.

Elephants did a great job in their assembly this week. It was all about anti-bullying and students either helped to make some signs or held them up in the assembly. We had fun making pyramids in History and learning about why the Ancient Egyptians built them. In Maths we have learnt about addition. We found it really interesting to find out about our muscles in Science — what they're called and what their function is. We have also begun a new vocational topic about time and the calendar.

In L class, we started a new unit in Science on 'Light'. We then began a new unit in Computing on 'Spreadsheets', where the class made images using the different cells on Excel.

Pupils continued with their 'English Culture' unit and learnt about the different regions of the UK as part of their vocational studies.



I am a mother of two grown daughters, and I am married to a Metropolitan Police Sergeant.

I was previously a Parent Governor at Marriotts School from 2012 to 2014 while my daughters spent their final years at the school.

I became an Associate Governor at Lonsdale in September 2016, a full Governor in September 2017 and Vice Chair and then the Chair of Governors in October 2022.

I am registered disabled and have found that with the free time I have, this has given me the opportunity to give back to my local community. I try to ensure I am at all Lonsdale events from Assemblies to the Christmas Fair. I feel that it is important for me as a governor to be in touch and visible with students, staff and parents. During Lockdown, I introduced class buddies which linked a governor with a class and teacher. This means that the children and staff know who we are and stops the Governors from being strangers in the school.

Before my disability, I worked in a Taxi insurance brokerage in Stevenage. It was great to interact with people from different cultures. I processed accident claims and dealt with the main insurance underwriting company. I left to go to NU to work in legacy pensions.

After I was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis, it made me re-think what I wanted from life. I now enjoy spending time in Lonsdale School. I work closely with the Vice Chair to ensure that the Headteacher and Senior Leadership Team work well and are supported. I take on training that can help me fulfil my role to the best of my ability. I feel that everyone is a life-long learner - whatever path they take in life.

I believe that every child deserves a good education, no matter their background, and I hope to help support the school in providing this.

Cyberbullying

What is Cyberbullying and online Harassment?

- Cyberbullying is any form of bullying which takes place online.
- This can be done over smartphones, tablets, online gaming, chat rooms, social media and more.
- Online harassment is the act of sending offensive, rude and insulting messages and being abusive.
- If someone purposefully keeps sending you offensive messages that make you feel scared, it could be illegal.



- Bullying someone whether online or offline is wrong.
- · It can badly affect their mental health.
- Harassing someone and/or sending malicious or threatening messages to someone repeatedly is ILLEGAL.
- If you are found to be cyberbullying someone, there could be criminal consequences.

How to cope with the effects of Cyberbullying

- You must not blame yourself. Noone deserves to treated cruely by anyone.
- It can make you feel very upset, alone and like noone will understand or help you.
- REMEMBER you are not alone and there are lots of people who can help you. Make sure you tell someone and do not try to deal with this on your own.

What to do if you are being cyberbullied

If someone is bullying you, here is what you can do to put a stop to it....get SMART.

Screenshot any nasty messages.

My privacy settings.

Avoid talking to them any further.

Report the incident on whatever site you are using.

Talk to someone (parent, carer, teacher, friend or the police if necessary).

When to tell the Police

- If you are ever threatened with physical harm, being repeatedly harassed, being sent malicious messages.
- If it's not an immediate emergency, phone 101 or use our online webchat service.
- If it is an immediate emergency phone 999.
