They also really enjoyed taking part in the Christmas Fair last Friday. They played the games and completed some of their Christmas shopping.

In Literacy we have been practicing our Christmas Performance and are looking forward to performing it this week. In Numeracy we developed our understanding of 2D and 3D shape properties and tallies. In Science we looked at transparent, translucent and opaque and which made the best shadow. We enjoyed being a production line and making cards for the Christmas Fair and were excellent in manning the stall and helping other pupils. We enjoyed Taskmaster with Wombats and Sea Turtles completing a Christmas Quiz.

SECONDARY News

The Wombats enjoyed revisiting the Christmas Story and used our set of knitted Nativity figures to arrange the stable scene. This was good preparation for their visit to our local church where they were told the story by Mary & Joseph, the shepherds & the wise men. This included craft activities & singing, and we were presented with a star to hang up in our classroom. We had a sticky but fun morning following instructions to make a melted snowman. The children did a great job in our class assembly last week, all about Advent. We had a great time at the pantomime – Oh, yes we did!!

The Hippos have had a great week! On Monday we continued our topic on Whitby, we compared the human geography in Stevenage and Whitby. In PSHCE, we had some discussions about consent, healthy relationships and how babies are made, which led perfectly into our learning in Science and which was related to the male and female re productive systems. On Thurs day we had a really exciting, day where we made preparations for our Christmas Fair, we made 'Pin the tail on the Rudolph' and 'Pin the nose on the Rudolph', we watched 'Elf' whilst we made them to get us in a Christmas mood, the Christmas Fair was lots of fun! On Friday we joined with Falcon Class to help them with their Maths.

We began the week last week by putting up our Christmas tree! In Science, the class has been learning about muscles. In Computing, they learnt about stereotypes and the media. In PSHCE, we learnt about helpful and unhelpful thoughts. We talked about how these different thoughts make us feel. The students then designed a 'Thought Superhero', which lives in their head and fights against unhelpful thoughts! In Geography, we learnt about France, and we also learnt some French words. On Thursday, we had a lovely Christmas-themed day making Christmas cards and ornaments as well as enjoying the Christmas Fair.

This week Gorilla Class finished the story, Kensuke's Kingdom, in English. They reviewed the book, and it was good to see what they could remember about the story, which they have heard over the last couple of months. In Science they have been looking at similarities & differences between human and animal bodies. They have also enjoyed some more seasonal activities such as some Christmas Maths challenges, and they had a very sticky morning following instructions to make a melting snowman.

This week has been very busy with lots of Christmas-themed activities, including making decorations for the school fair. They attended this on Thursday, and lots of gifts were bought and activities were completed. In English, we continued with the next chapters of 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas', and the story is making its way to its conclusion. Pupils learned that Father has planned for Bruno, Mother and Gretel to return to Berlin, and Bruno has to contemplate leaving his friend Shmuel behind. Get the help that fits your family, so you can juggle work and life

Thousands of families could be saving money on their childcare costs. But some simply don't know what support they might be eligible for. The Childcare Choices website brings together all the existing childcare offers in one place, so parents can get the help that fits their family. This could be through Tax-Free Childcare, 30 Hours Childcare, or Universal Credit Childcare. Some families might be eligible to use more than one childcare scheme together and get the most out of it. And from next year even more help is on the way:

- From April 2024, eligible working parents in England with children aged 2 will have access to 15 hours childcare.
- From September 2024, the 15 hours childcare offer will be expanded to eligible working parents in England with children between 9 and 23 months old.
- From September 2025, eligible working parents in England with children between 9 months up to school age will have access to 30 hours childcare.

Support is also expanding for primary-school aged children, from September 2024, parents are expected to see an expansion in the availability of childcare in their local area before and after school, between 8am and 6pm, also known as 'wraparound care'. Don't miss out on getting the support you are entitled to.

Cyberbullying

What is Cyberbullying and online Harassment?

- Cyberbullying is any form of bullying which takes place online.
- This can be done over smartphones, tablets, online gaming, chat rooms, social media and more.
- Online harassment is the act of sending offensive, rude and insulting messages and being abusive.
- If someone purposefully keeps sending you offensive messages that make you feel scared, it could be illegal.

Cyberbullying is NOT ACCEPTABLE

- Bullying someone whether online or offline is wrong.
- It can badly affect their mental health.
- Harassing someone and/or sending malicious or threatening messages to someone repeatedly is ILLEGAL.
- If you are found to be cyberbullying someone, there could be criminal consequences.

How to cope with the effects of Cyberbullying

- You must not blame yourself. Noone deserves to treated cruely by anyone.
- It can make you feel very upset, alone and like noone will understand or help you.
- REMEMBER you are not alone and there are lots of people who can help you. Make sure you tell someone and do not try to deal with this on your own.

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What to do if you are being cyberbullied

If someone is bullying you, here is what you can do to put a stop to it....get SMART.

- Screenshot any nasty messages.
- My privacy settings.
- Avoid talking to them any further.
- Report the incident on whatever site you are using.
- Talk to someone (parent, carer, teacher, friend or the police if necessary).

When to tell the Police

- If you are ever threatened with physical harm, being repeatedly harassed, being sent malicious messages.
- If it's not an immediate emergency, phone 101 or use our online webchat service.
- If it is an immediate emergency phone 999.
