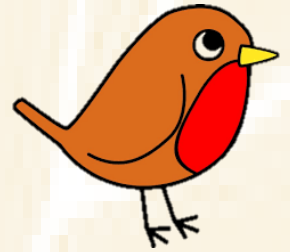




PRIMARY

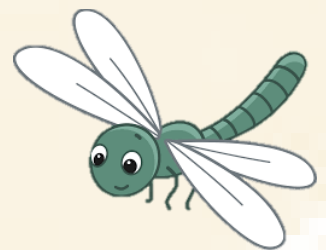
MONKEY CLASS

They have begun their new topics History of Travel and Transport and Earth and Space. In DT, the children have been learning about and designing their own pizza and in Computing they were working on using 'Paint' to design. In English, pupils have been learning about letter writing using The Jolly Postman as their inspiration.



ALPACA CLASS

Dragonfly Class had a lovely first week back, celebrating the New Year, sharing our Christmas celebrations, and making resolutions. Pupils were very excited to see each other! They were introduced to lots of new topics for this half term, with our main focus being 'Earth and Space'. Students began the Geography topic on 'The Water Cycle' by looking at Earth from space and noticing how much water covers our planet. Children shared some very creative ideas how it moves around the planet! Next week, we will begin a unit on letter writing in English, and cultural patterns in Art.

We joined in assembly on Wednesday to find out about the school's new leadership team and their roles.

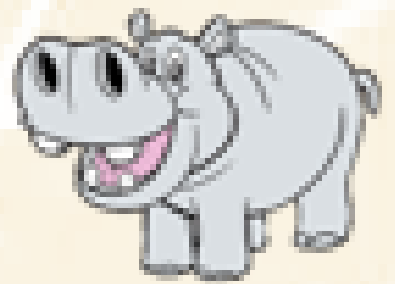

In English, children started the topic on Traditional Tales, looking at some of the key elements of these types of stories. In Science, they started their topic on Sound, learning about different types of sound. In PE, the class created 'shapes' during Gymnastics.

It's been a lovely first week back for Gorilla Class! We have enjoyed hearing about everyone's holidays and getting to grips with lots of new topics! In English, we wrote brilliant sentences using 5Ws words (What, Where, Who, When, Why). During the Maths sessions we have been exploring the weight of different objects!

Welcome back to school to all our pupils in V Class. It has been lovely to hear everybody's news about their holidays and the various activities they have been up to. We have started a new cross-curricular project centred around the Ancient Greeks. The challenge for the pupils is to be able to identify and relate the learning to its more common subject area. 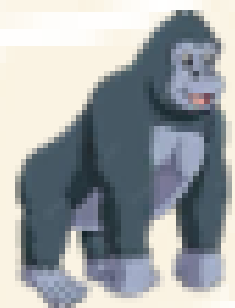

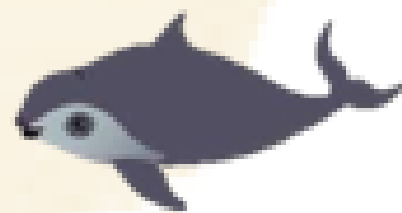

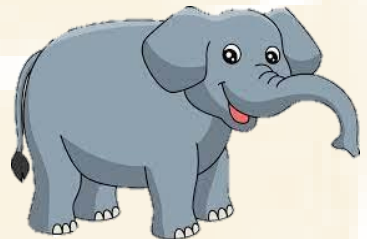

I am Tasmanian Devils Class Teacher, Lead for the Deaf & Hard of Hearing and a Staff Governor at Lonsdale. When I'm not teaching, you will find me at the gym or relaxing at home and catching up on the latest TV and film releases.

Before children, I trained as a Graphic Designer and did that for ten years before my hearing took a nose-dive and children came along. In 2010, I decided to pursue a new career in teaching and supporting SEN children, utilising my British Sign language skills and understanding of inclusion and differentiation; I haven't looked back since. I teach adults British Sign Language qualifications in my spare time and am very excited to hear that British Sign Language is to become a recognised GCSE language; I aim to introduce this to Lonsdale for our children to learn and achieve it as a qualification.

As a deaf person, I face daily challenges. Therefore, I am committed to ensuring that all students with disabilities and special needs have access to education and can reach their full potential. My goal is to provide every child at Lonsdale with the tools and resources to provide them with the courage and ambition to succeed and to ensure that no one feels left out or behind. Being a SEN teacher gives me immense joy as I see the happiness that even the simplest things can bring to my students. I advocate for SEN students, committed to giving everyone a voice and incorporating their ideas and suggestions to make Lonsdale the best school it can be.

People often ask me how I manage to juggle everything while caring for my busy household, including enough teenage boys to form my own football team. I enjoy staying organized and taking advantage of new learning opportunities to be the best version of myself.

Get the help that fits your family, so you can juggle work and life

Thousands of families could be saving money on their childcare costs. But some simply don't know what support they might be eligible for. The Childcare Choices website brings together all the existing childcare offers in one place, so parents can get the help that fits their family. This could be through Tax-Free Childcare, 30 Hours Childcare, or Universal Credit Childcare. Some families might be eligible to use more than one childcare scheme together and get the most out of it. And from next year even more help is on the way:

- From April 2024, eligible working parents in England with children aged 2 will have access to 15 hours childcare.
- From September 2024, the 15 hours childcare offer will be expanded to eligible working parents in England with children between 9 and 23 months old.
- From September 2025, eligible working parents in England with children between 9 months up to school age will have access to 30 hours childcare.

Support is also expanding for primary-school aged children, from September 2024, parents are expected to see an expansion in the availability of childcare in their local area before and after school, between 8am and 6pm, also known as 'wraparound care'. Don't miss out on getting the support you are entitled to.

Cyberbullying

What is Cyberbullying and online Harassment?

- Cyberbullying is any form of bullying which takes place online.
- This can be done over smartphones, tablets, online gaming, chat rooms, social media and more.
- Online harassment is the act of sending offensive, rude and insulting messages and being abusive.
- If someone purposefully keeps sending you offensive messages that make you feel scared, it could be illegal.



Cyberbullying is NOT ACCEPTABLE

- Bullying someone whether online or offline is wrong.
- It can badly affect their mental health.
- Harassing someone and/or sending malicious or threatening messages to someone repeatedly is **ILLEGAL**.
- If you are found to be cyberbullying someone, there could be criminal consequences.

What to do if you are being cyberbullied

If someone is bullying you, here is what you can do to put a stop to it....get **SMART**.

Screenshot any nasty messages.

My privacy settings.

Avoid talking to them any further.

Report the incident on whatever site you are using.

Talk to someone (parent, carer, teacher, friend or the police if necessary).

How to cope with the effects of Cyberbullying

- You must not blame yourself. No one deserves to be treated cruelly by anyone.
- It can make you feel very upset, alone and like no one will understand or help you.
- **REMEMBER** you are not alone and there are lots of people who can help you. Make sure you tell someone and do not try to deal with this on your own.

When to tell the Police

- If you are ever threatened with physical harm, being repeatedly harassed, being sent malicious messages.
- If it's not an immediate emergency, phone **101** or use our online webchat service.
