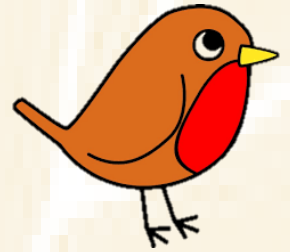




# PRIMARY

## News

As the weather has turned colder, Robin Class have been exploring all things winter. We started the week with 'One snowy night', a sensory story. In Mathematics, we played a game with a dice and drew a snowman. During the K & U, we put water outside and left it overnight to explore the ice on the following day.



ROBIN CLASS

In Monkey Class, pupils have been developing their understanding of non-fiction books in English. They have chosen a topic, made a front page and then made a contents page. In Maths, they have continued working on number order and 1:1 correspondence as well as properties of shapes. In Science, they have role played being an astronaut travelling to different planets, looking at the colours. They made their own longboat in History. Thank you for continuing to send photos for news on Tapestry.



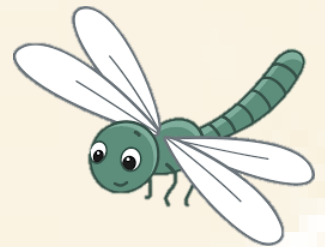
MONKEY CLASS

Alpaca Class have been working hard this week. In English the children have been developing their reading comprehension skills. In maths they consolidated their knowledge of 10 as a number made of many combinations. In science they had fun exploring sphere shapes and making playdoh planets. The children did well discussing different pictures of transport, identifying past and present. In PHSCE, the children explored things they should think and things OK to say.



ALPACA CLASS

Dragonfly Class had a lovely week continuing our space exploration! We focused on the sun and moon - using key vocabulary to compare them, learning about orbiting, and how moon craters are formed! In English, we are beginning to discuss formal and informal letters before pupils write their own, and in Maths pupils are exploring measure. Some great discussions about the water cycle were had in Geography, and pupils loved sharing their views on our school in PSHCE.



DRAGONFLY CLASS

In Literacy, we enjoyed listening to the Rapunzel story and answering comprehension questions. In Numeracy, we looked at adding numbers and reading thermometers. In Science, we looked at how the Earth, Sun and Moon all move around each other and in Geography we discussed where water comes from using the water cycle. We enjoyed practicing the recovery position in Life Skills and making board games with Sea Turtles and Wombats in TaskMaster!

# SECONDARY

## News

Our new English topic is Poetry. Pupils have been writing 'Who Am I?' poems about themselves and have heard and written poems about wintery weather. They have had some great ideas! In the week beginning 29th Jan, they will be writing poems about animals, so if they have a pet at home & would like to bring a photo to base their work on, please send one in that day or email to Mrs H in advance. In D&T they have been at the early stages of making a hand warmer. Most pupils have been using a pattern for a penguin and some have chosen to attempt a robin. In Science, we continued to learn about sound, and we have identified the different sections of the ear. In Math, we have been practicing our number skills and revising our knowledge of shapes and their properties.

A great week in Hippo Class! In RE, we learnt about Sikhism and how the Sikhism religion was founded. In Science, we started our new topic, Sound. We learnt that sound is created by vibrations, we used a tuning fork to make ripples in water and watched the rice vibrate on a drum when we hit it. In PSHE we talked about things we would like to keep, improve, start new and scrap for the school as requested by Mrs Thiele who is keen to hear our ideas! In Math, we have been doing division and learning the bus stop method. In English we took mock exams, Mrs North is very impressed by how much we have learnt. In History, we continued our Crime and Punishment topic; we learnt about the Anglo-Saxon justice system and compared this to the Criminal Justice System we have in England today.

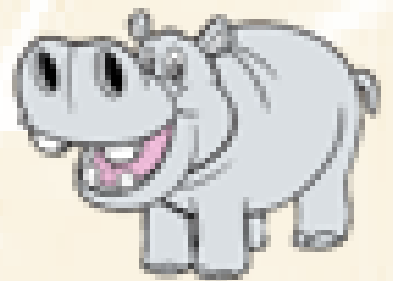
Students started last week by planning their own 'Traditional Tale' - there were some very interesting ideas! In Science, they did a survey on sounds that they can hear around school. In Computing, we learnt about Algorithms and had a go at programming our Blue Bots. In Math, the Class have been learning about 3D shapes. They went around the school finding examples of different shapes. In History, we started to learn about Crime and Punishment in the Anglo-Saxon times. In their second English lesson, the Class listened to the story of 'The Emperor's New Clothes' and discussed the moral behind it. In Creative, they started to paint some cave paintings. In PE, we continued to do some Gymnastics.

Gorillas have been looking at their new topic 'Transport' this week. They have begun to explore what transport looked like in the past and how it had changed. In Maths, we have been estimating if objects are heavier or lighter and looking at different types of measurement. In English, we have begun to get to grips with our Poetry Unit on The Magic Box. We have been looking at different types of boxes and describing them.

This week, pupils have explored many cross curricular aspects about Ancient Greece. They completed fact files about the gods (RE), learned which cities and places remain as part of modern Greece by comparing maps (Geography), aspects of their culture and organisation (History). In addition (note the pun) they learned about how buildings were constructed and use of triangular pediments as decorative features. Their Literacy task was to read and retrieve information from a text using source materials from the week's lessons.



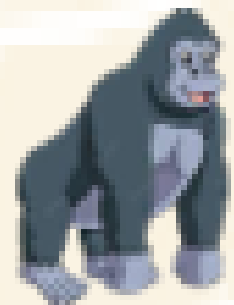

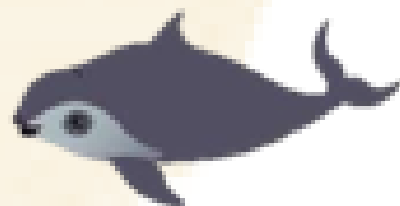

## News

LONSDALE



Tasmanian Devils have been hard at work this week with looking at how the Egyptians decorated their pyramids, reflecting the craftsmanship without modern day utensils and reproduced this in our Art lesson. In Science we have been exploring sound, how it is created and why some people can hear better than others. In Geography, we have been looking closer at Eastern European Capital Cities and Countries. In English we have been working hard at polishing our Functional Skills and looking deeper at how to achieve full markings.



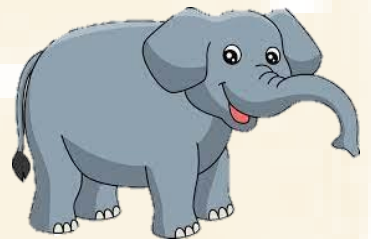
TASMANIAN DEVIL

In Math this week, our GCSE pupils have been learning about factorising by nominals and our FS pupils have been learning how to solve division using the bus-stop method. In Science, we conducted an experiment to measure viscosity. In Computing we have been learning about the COUNTIF function in spreadsheets and revising our knowledge of other functions. We continue to learn about relationships within RSE, we have been learning about different cultures.



PANDA CLASS

We have enjoyed learning about fractions in Maths by halving shapes. In English, we continued learning about poetry and thought about adjectives to describe Arctic or Antarctic animals. In Science, we investigated different sounds. We learnt about Anglo-Saxon place names and their meanings in history. As part of our Vocational lesson, we sorted recycling into the correct bins.



ELEPHANT CLASS

Another busy week in Lynx Class. During the Math sessions we have been learning about dividing numbers with remainder using the bus stop method. Also, we challenged ourselves with completing Functional Skills Practice Tests. In Science we looked at Sound and how it travels through different materials. On our Vocational lesson we have been researching and gathering information about everyday life in Ancient Greece. In Creative, we looked at work of Pablo Picasso.

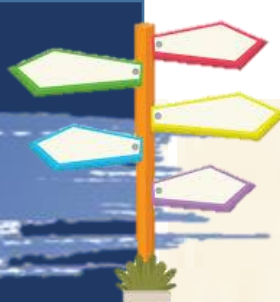

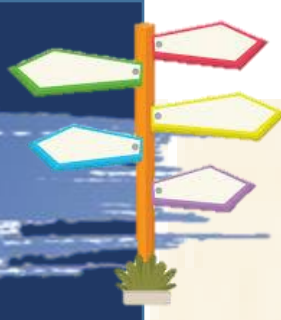

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## **Get the help that fits your family, so you can juggle work and life**

Thousands of families could be saving money on their childcare costs. But some simply don't know what support they might be eligible for. The Childcare Choices website brings together all the existing childcare offers in one place, so parents can get the help that fits their family. This could be through Tax-Free Childcare, 30 Hours Childcare, or Universal Credit Childcare. Some families might be eligible to use more than one childcare scheme together and get the most out of it. And from next year even more help is on the way:

- From April 2024, eligible working parents in England with children aged 2 will have access to 15 hours childcare.
- From September 2024, the 15 hours childcare offer will be expanded to eligible working parents in England with children between 9 and 23 months old.
- From September 2025, eligible working parents in England with children between 9 months up to school age will have access to 30 hours childcare.

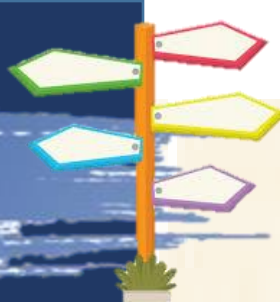
Support is also expanding for primary-school aged children, from September 2024, parents are expected to see an expansion in the availability of childcare in their local area before and after school, between 8am and 6pm, also known as 'wraparound care'. Don't miss out on getting the support you are entitled to.

## Cyberbullying

### What is Cyberbullying and online Harassment?

- Cyberbullying is any form of bullying which takes place online.
- This can be done over smartphones, tablets, online gaming, chat rooms, social media and more.
- Online harassment is the act of sending offensive, rude and insulting messages and being abusive.
- If someone purposefully keeps sending you offensive messages that make you feel scared, it could be illegal.



### Cyberbullying is NOT ACCEPTABLE

- Bullying someone whether online or offline is wrong.
- It can badly affect their mental health.
- Harassing someone and/or sending malicious or threatening messages to someone repeatedly is **ILLEGAL**.
- If you are found to be cyberbullying someone, there could be criminal consequences.

### What to do if you are being cyberbullied

If someone is bullying you, here is what you can do to put a stop to it....get **SMART**.

**S**creenshot any nasty messages.

**M**y privacy settings.

**A**void talking to them any further.

**R**eport the incident on whatever site you are using.

**T**alk to someone (parent, carer, teacher, friend or the police if necessary).

### How to cope with the effects of Cyberbullying

- You must not blame yourself. No one deserves to be treated cruelly by anyone.
- It can make you feel very upset, alone and like no one will understand or help you.
- **REMEMBER** you are not alone and there are lots of people who can help you. Make sure you tell someone and do not try to deal with this on your own.

### When to tell the Police

- If you are ever threatened with physical harm, being repeatedly harassed, being sent malicious messages.

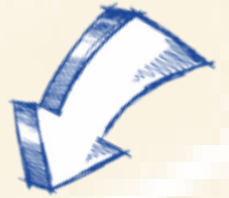
