PRIMARY



News

This week Robin Class have continued learning about Space. They have played parachute games to support their understanding of the Earth spinning. The children have been learning about day and night using torches and star projectors. In PSHE, they have revisited The Colour Monster story and sorted colours into feelings jars. They enjoyed making playdough and using it to make their very own colour monsters. In Maths, the pupils have been looking at size with the help of the duck family.

Monkey Class have been learning about Day and Night, being the Sun, Earth and Moon and rotating the Earth to see when it is Day or Night. In Maths, the children have worked on both adding a subtracting and using this knowledge to weigh how heavy or light an object is. In History, they looked at the history of flight, made a hot air balloon and paper airplanes, testing if they would fly. In PE, pupils created a dance using props.

Alpaca Class have been learning about Day and Night and the rotation of the Earth in Science. They used their knowledge to draw a Day and Night picture in their Computing lesson. In Maths, the children have worked with number lines to find missing numbers. In PHSCE, the children practiced giving complements. During the Outdoor Learning, the pupils collected twigs, leaves and seeds which they used after to make a number line.

Dragonfly Class had a fantastic week continuing to learn about the water cycle with a practical experiment. We were very impressed with pupils using the words 'evaporation' and 'precipitation'. In Science, pupils focused on the planets and had lots of fun ordering them and learning their names. A highlight of the week was being 'game testers' for F, W & S classes – where we got the test board games brought to life! There were lots of giggles, costumes, and ample team spirit.

In Literacy, we enjoyed listening to the Frog Prince story and answering comprehension questions. In Numeracy, we looked at weighing objects and estimating which one is heavier. In Science, we looked at history of space travel and designed our own space craft. In Geography, we looked at UK rivers and what sea they run into. We enjoyed writing out instructions to make squash in Life Skills and bringing board games to life in Taskmaster with Sea Turtles and Wombats.

LONSDALE

In English, the class have performed 'Who has seen the wind?', outside on a breezy day. We recorded each person, and they loved seeing and hearing themselves on the screen. We are hoping to use these in assembly next week. In Geography, we have compared the human geography of both Whitby & Stevenage. The D & T project is going well - this week they attached beaks to their handwarmer penguins & robins. The class also attended a workshop on the theme of Mental Health

Hippos have worked really hard this week. In RE, they learnt about Gurdwaras as part of our Sikhism topic. In History pupils learned about Tudor punishments and the sorts of crimes the Tudors would commit. In PSHE, they talked about mental health and how our voices matter as part of Children's Mental Health Week. In Science, the students learned about sound and completed their own decibel experiment. Pupils tested various sounds such gurgling, whispering and Miss Bradbery's car horn! In cooking they made White Chocolate Blondies which were very tasty! It has been a great week!

In English, we are designing a computer game. Last week, we started by deciding what our characters were going to be in the game by describing them and then in Computing, we used Paint to start designing them. On Tuesday, the Class took part in a Children's Mental Health Week workshop discussing things that make them happy. We continued the conversation in class about the importance of everyone having someone they can trust to talk to if they need to. After, we had a bit of fun playing some games of large Snakes and Ladders! In Science, we played some musical instruments as part of our less on on Sound. In Creative, we made pieces of jewellery out of clay.

In English, the Gorilla's have been working hard using a range of adjectives to describe the magical boxes they created. In Maths, they have been looking at measurement and matching the numbers to measure the correct amount. For Mental Health Week, we have focused on things we are proud of. It has been wonderful to see their ideas.

In Maths, pupils used their skills in fractions/dividing and sharing to work out the exit route from the labyrinth. In English, they have learned more about the story of St. Valentine in preparation for an assembly on Monday (12th). For the Ancient Greek topic work, we have explored the history of Alexander the Great and pupils were working out the extent of the empire and comparing it to where current sovereign countries are located.

Well done to all students in TD Class, you have worked extremely hard and continuously looking at ways to excel!

We started off by looking at the comparable differences of culture in Eastern European cities, then stopped in Egypt to see how the Ancient Egyptians wrapped the dead. In Creative, we finished off our Bronze Age Jewellery which has pride of place in the TD Museum.

In Computing, we learned about sequencing in Scratch which is a programming software. In Functional Skill English some of us have been learning about purposes of text. In GCSE English, some of us have been learning how to infer, compare and contrast in texts. In Function Skills Maths, we have been further developing our money skills and learning to write cheques. In GCSE Maths, we have been developing our skills and learning how to solve the value of X. In PSHE, we played Articulate to develop our understanding of mental health as it is Children's Mental Health Week.

We have been having fun making up silly sentences using alliteration in English. In Maths, we made Rockpool Fractions, dividing them into halves and quarters. In Science, we categorised natural and human-made sounds. We learnt about Anglo-Saxon gods and goddesses in History. During our Computing lesson we have been learning how to take videos.

Another great week in Lynx Class. In Maths, we continued focusing on money and giving change from £1, £2, £5, £10; thinking of budgeting and why it is important. We have also tried to fill in a cheque and completed some Functional Skills questions involving money. In Vocational, we continued exploring Greek gods, goddesses and their powers. In Creative, we looked at the different Picasso paintings and chose the one we would like to paint.


