Summary of PPG spending
<p>Objectives in spending PPG:</p> <p>Key Principles <i>Building Belief</i> We will provide a culture where:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • staff believe in ALL children • there are “no excuses” made for underperformance • staff adopt a “solution-focused” approach to overcoming barriers • staff support children to develop growth and resilience in their own learning and development <p><i>Analysing Data</i> We will ensure that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All staff are involved in the analysis of data so that they are fully aware of strengths and weaknesses across the school



Identification of Pupils

We will ensure that:

- ALL teaching staff and support staff are involved in analysis of data and identification of pupils
- ALL staff are aware of who pupil premium and vulnerable children are
- ALL pupil premium children benefit from the funding, not just those who are underperforming
- Underachievement at all levels is targeted (not just lower attaining pupils)
- Pupil individual needs are considered carefully so that we provide support for those children who could be doing “even better if.....”

Summary of spending and actions taken:

Activity	Outline of Activity	Participation (student no.)
Counselling	Counselling is a key intervention for school. Students see the counsellor to talk about a wide range of issues (from study difficulties to coping with trauma).	7
Trips	The school encourages class trips to enhance learning and experiencing new things. All trips are chargeable and therefore the PPG ensures that all students are able to participate.	22
IT Software	Specialist software is purchased to ensure that pupils have access both in school and home to help with the continuity of learning	22
Play therapy	Play therapy is for our younger students who are unable to access the counsellor.	3
Other interventions	Vocabulary learning, reading, horse riding and extra subjects are on offer to support PP students but to state each one separately will identify the individual concerned.	

Outcomes to date:

Staff and parents have commented in feedback that students are more settled, more focused and the length of their concentration has improved following targeted interventions and being able to attend trips. They feel part of the whole school community and enjoy learning.

The progress and achievements of our Pupil-Premium pupils are in line with whole-school progress. Fewer Pupil-Premium pupils did not meet their target by July 2016 in all core subjects compared to the whole school. Individual Pupil Premium Plans, part of the Horizons Assessment Package, have helped pupils, staff, parents and other professionals identify barriers to learning. Interventions and support in place to overcome these. The monitoring of progress ensured that Pupil-Premium pupils were supported well and that the interventions provided had a positive impact on their progress.

In REP, Pupil-Premium pupils performed less well compared to whole school in some area. School and REP will look at how Pupil-Premium pupils can be better supported in their learning in REP to make at least the same or better progress than their peers.
